



To all the friends of ECO,

What an incredible year! On behalf of the students, teachers, and communities we serve across the Pacific Northwest, the ECO Team wants to say thank you. Your support is connecting more students with nature than ever before.

Over the 2018-19 school year, ECO nearly tripled its reach by merging with a nonprofit (Dig In Community), a corporation (The Green Schoolhouse), and a longstanding community ecology education program (the Siuslaw Watershed Program).

These mergers propelled ECO into new regions, enabled us to provide year-round programming, and extended our program reach to grades K-12, in 37 schools, across 14 school districts throughout urban and rural communities. ECO grew 250% in just one year and went from serving 2,880 to 6,330 students!

The experienced, and talented ECO Team also grew (thankfully!) from a staff of 6 to 11 to accommodate all this monumental growth.

Transformation creates opportunity, and we are thrilled beyond measure for the future of ECO. It's all thanks to you. Because of your support, we're empowering more students than ever before to become the environmental stewards, advocates, and change-makers our future needs.

ECO'S YEAR OF EXPANSION

Thanks to your support, ECO grew dramatically in 2018-19. We have expanded programs to the Oregon Coast and in the Siuslaw Watershed, extended service learning for new grade levels, and added after school and summer camp programs reaching students all year. In the 2017-18 school year, ECO served 2,880 students, delivered 396 lessons, and led 33 field trips, for a total of 9,000 contact hours of hands-on ecology programming. 

SERVICE-LEARNING FOR MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL

Our merger with Dig In Community brought our programs to 6th through 12th-graders, creating mentorship opportunities while improving the health of our local watersheds!


Students traveled to a stream in the upper watershed to do a "salmon toss"—depositing of salmon carcasses into a stream to mimic the way native salmon died after spawning before their paths were blocked by dams and development. Through the toss, students deposit vital nutrients for countless organisms, such as juvenile fish, bald eagles, and macroinvertebrates.





PLACE-BASED UNIT UPDATE

ECO has developed a total of 12 units, complete with a game, in-depth teacher guides, and integrated, multidisciplinary lessons about our local ecology. ECO is committed to creating access to high quality, hands-on ecology education, and these kits will allow us to do this like never before. 





ECO inspires students to care for nature and their local communities through hands-on science education.


